- Make the required changes and set the visibility to **public** and workflow status to **for approval.**
- Enter new research projects that are missing from your profile and set the visibility to **public** and workflow status to **for approval.**
- Add relations to publications and other relevant content in Pure.
- If relevant: add the url of the Project website

After a project has been approved by the Pure administator of FSS (Rob Kloppenburg) it will become visible in your online profile.
