SUMMARY OF WORK EXPERIENCE

Denyse J. Snelder obtained her PhD in 1993 at the University of Toronto, Canada, based on research directed at vegetative control of soil erosion in the semi-arid Baringo District, Kenya. Up to December 2012, she had a dual position, one as senior specialist Sustainable Land and Water Management at the Centre for International Cooperation, Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam, and another as an associate professor at the Institute of Environmental Sciences Leiden (CML), Leiden University, The Netherlands.

Since January 2013 she holds a full-time position at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam as senior advisor and partner or director of various research and capacity building projects, such as, autonomiser les pauvres en milieu urbain au Bénin: utiliser les jardins urbains pour entrer dans la chaîne de valeur alimentaire (Jardin Pro Pauvre; OKP-TMT, funded by NUFFIC; 2021- present); Video gamEs foR Skills trAining (VERSA; funded by EC - H2020-SwafS, 2021-present); EnGEndering Mentorship (e-GEM; OKP-TMT, funded by NUFFIC; 2021--present); spatial planning for agribusiness and public policy development in Greater Western Kenya (SPADE; NICHE, funded by NUFFIC; 2017 - 2022); natural resource management and conflict resolution for stability and inclusive growth in the Greater Virunga Landscape (3C project; NICHE, funded by NUFFIC; 2017-2022); a sustainable approach to livelihood improvement in Kenya (ASALI funded through a legacy by VU Amsterdam; 2014 – present); capacity building for Higher Education Institutes in natural resource management, tourism, and ecotourism in Ethiopia (STRONGBOW funded by NUFFIC; 2011-2017); water harvesting technologies in Sub Saharan Africa (WHaTeR funded by EU-FP7; 2011-2015). Before 2009, Dr Snelder was the coordinator and later head of the Cagayan Valley Program in the Philippines, and, over the past years, extended her activities through projects in Sub Saharan Africa. She

further contributes to various courses and training in the field of food and water security, International Development (VU-UvA-UAC Honours programme), sustainable land and water management, research design and proposal writing, and curriculum review and development.
