

## Tool to monitor the local Implementation of Integrated Care for Childhood overweight and Obesity (TICCO) Questionnaire

### TICCO for professionals involved in the project organization

Commitment	
1	Professionals involved in integrated care for childhood overweight and obesity share a collective vision of the support and care of those affected
2	Integrated care partners are agreed on the importance of integrated work (which links the medical, social and public domains)
3	Within the integrated care approach, care partners have defined collective, concrete goals and ambitions
4	Within the integrated care approach, partners are agreed on how participating organizations are to collaborate
5	The organizations participating in integrated care for childhood overweight and obesity have signed a collaboration agreement
6	The managers of the participating organizations are committed to the success of the integrated care approach
7	There are regular consultations between the managers of the organizations in the integrated care approach
8	Partners in the integrated care approach have agreed on what they expect from potential new partners
Inter-professional teamwork	
9	The target group of the integrated care approach has been clearly defined

10	The professionals participating in the integrated care approach are fully aware of, and up to date on, each other's expertise and tasks
11	Where necessary, further clarification of roles and tasks is achieved through mutual consultation between professionals
12	In the integrated care approach, medical, social, and public domain professionals work together
13	There is regular direct (face to face or telephone) contact between the different professionals working in integrated care
14	The integrated care approach is characterized by a culture in which professionals address each other in a professional way with regard to responsibilities and agreements
15	The integrated care approach for childhood overweight and obesity also allows the professionals involved to contact each other more easily in other case types
<b>Quality of support and care</b>	
16	Within the integrated care approach the needs and desires of the target group are periodically collected and mapped
17	Support and care in the integrated care approach are attuned to the needs of the target group (children with overweight and obesity, or their parents)
18	Representatives of the target group (children with overweight or obesity, or their parents) are involved in improvement processes within the integrated care approach
<b>Client-centeredness</b>	
19	Children and the families are given clear, unambiguous information by the professionals in the integrated care approach

20	The support offered within the integrated care approach is tailored to the individual needs of children and families
21	Within the integrated care approach, a professional works with the family to identify appropriate support (whether from the social network, medical, social and/or public domain)
22	There is a clear, central information point where parents can go with questions (or complaints) about the local integrated care approach
23	The integrated care approach offers opportunities to tailor support for families that have complex care needs or multiple problems
<b>Delivery system</b>	
24	Agreements have been reached on procedures for the handling and exchange of client data and information on the family
25	Agreements have been reached on when, and to whom, a child or family should be referred to integrated care
26	Agreements have been reached on when the care requirement ends, and how support and care are brought to a close
27	Within the integrated care approach, coordinating professionals are deployed who coordinate support and care at the case level
28	Professionals in the integrated care approach work with each family to create a tailored plan of action for that family
29	Organizations in the integrated care approach make use of the links between their digital information systems (such as 'zorgmail', 'zorgdomein')

<b>Results-focused learning</b>	
30	The integrated care approach makes use of collaborative education programmes
31	Integrated care partners share knowledge between each other on the continuing improvement of the integrated care approach
32	The integrated care approach is characterized by a culture in which learning, improving and innovating are stimulated and facilitated
33	Incentives (e.g. recognition, social or financial benefits) rewarding the achievement of quality goals have been integrated into the integrated care system
<b>Monitoring</b>	
34	The intake, progression and outflow of children and families in the integrated care approach are monitored
35	The functioning of the integrated care approach is monitored
36	The results of the integrated care approach for children and families (as a group) are monitored
37	Partners within the integrated care approach have agreed on which outcome measures or performance indicators will be monitored
38	The integrated care approach uses a systematic, cyclic process of monitoring, evaluation and feedback
39	Professionals are informed of the results of the monitoring of the integrated care approach

	The results of monitoring and evaluation are systematically used for improvement processes
<b>Organization and financing</b>	
41	The integrated care approach has been given a clear organizational structure
42	There is a clear client-contractor relationship in the delivery of the integrated care approach
43	The partners in the integrated care approach have committed themselves to joint responsibility for the achievement of goals and results
44	Individual partners in the integrated care approach understand the costs and benefits of their participation (e.g. growth or decrease in required capacity, or financial consequences)
45	Agreements have been reached on the financial budget for the integrated care approach
46	There exists structural funding for the support and care of children with overweight or obesity (through agreements between municipalities, implementing bodies, and/or health insurers)
47	The organization and funding of the local integrated care approach are structurally guaranteed
